I suppose you can make some of it back on the pool table as it is free to play.

All and all, Crocodile is definitely a good option for a rest and relaxing chill-eekend spot. Also, and I cannot emphasize this enough, I recommend this place for singles (if you know what I mean). When I was there, I noticed a lot of good looking people (myself excluded) just hanging out and having fun. To get there, head towards Chatan AEON mall. In front of the Chatan AEON is a huge parking lot that is used by people who are going to the Mihama Seven Plex. Crocodile is across the street from the east side exit of this parking.

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# Daruma Temple

Tucked away amongst the busy streets behind Shuri Castle, the bustling Daruma Temple is one of the best examples of a traditional Buddhist Temple in Okinawa. Like many Buddhist temples in Japan it coexists alongside the local Shinto Shrine. Let's digress for a minute - the two major religions in Japan are Buddhism and Shinto. Buddhism came to Japan from China and worships Buddha at a Temple whereas Shinto is indigenous to Japan and is the worship of nature at Shrines. The two religions share various features and as many people in Japan belong to both it is common for Temples and Shrines to be built together.

The Daruma Temple in Naha has all of the features you might expect from a Temple visit in Japan - incense burners, impressive Buddha statue, ema (those small wooden plaques) and the Shrine is dominated by an impressive walkway of red torii gates leading to an altar at the end. Throughout the Temple/Shrine complex there are colourful daruma dolls which can be purchased from the shop within the Temple main hall. Another feature of such places seems to be the presence of friendly cats lazing around in the sun, always a highlight of my son's day.



The atmosphere at the Daruma Temple is peaceful despite it being busy and at times noisy. The locals were welcoming towards us and we felt comfortable to light some incense and watch the smoke circle around us, it really does create a calm and tranquil moment. The shop inside sells an array of daruma plus omamori amulets, ema and Inari fox statues; all have their own significance or of course you can just choose what you like the look of. There are plenty of unique things to see here, every nook is packed full of unique details and the atmosphere and feel of the place are a defining characteristic of traditional Japan. It's a wonderful addition to a solo or family day adventure in Naha.

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# 達磨寺

首里城裏の賑やかな通りの間に隠れるように存在する達磨寺は、沖縄県内にある伝統的な仏教寺の中でも紹介するのにいちばんいい例だと言えるでしょう。この場所は、日本の多くの仏教寺院と同じように神社と一緒に建てられています。ちょっと話が脱線しますが、日本の二大宗教は仏教と神道であり、仏教は中国から伝来し寺院でブッダを崇拝するのに対し、神道は日本固有のもので神社で自然を崇拝すると言われています。この2つの宗教にはさまざまな共通点があり、日本では多くの人が両方を信仰しているため、寺院と神社と一緒に建てられることがよくあるのです。那覇の達磨寺には、香炉、印象的な仏像、絵馬など、日本のお寺と言えば、という定番のものもあつたり、神社には、赤い鳥居が印象的な通路がありその先にある祭壇へと続いています。寺院と神社の敷地内至る所に名称の由来となっている色とりどりのだるまがあり、寺院本堂の中にある売店で購入することもできます。また、人懐っこい猫が日なたで昼寝しているところに出会うこともあり、私の息子はいつもそれを楽しみに訪れているようです。

達磨寺はにぎやかで騒がしい時もありますが、雰囲気は基本的に穏やかです。地元の人たちもいつもあたたかく歓迎してくれ、お香をたいて煙に包まれているのも心地よく、本当に静かで落ち着く時間を過ごすことができました。店内には、だるまやお守り、絵馬、稻荷の狐の像などがあり、それぞれに意味があるのでそれに基づいて購入することもできますし、単純に見た目が好きなものを選ぶのもよいでしょう。敷地のどこを見ても細かな工夫がなされ、場所の雰囲気や感じは日本の伝統的な雰囲気も感じられます。那覇での一人旅や家族でのお出かけに、いつもと違う素晴らしい時間を与えてくれると思います。

### *Sunflower Fields in Kitanakagusuku*

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# Mihama Shokudo

If you have been on island for longer than a day, you may be familiar with shokudos which are very known as a place where you can get cheap, delicious, and fast Japanese food. However, with the abundance of shokudos on island, it is very competitive and difficult to really stick out among the rest. At Mihama Shokudo, its popularity has managed to reach even the folks in mainland Japan as its location is superb situated between Camp Foster and Kadena Air Base making it an extremely convenient place to grab a quick lunch before heading back to work.

As would be expected in a typical shokudo, Mihama Shokudo offers all the traditional classics such as the tonkatsu, sobas, and champurus. Their signature dish - the bone soup – is a beef bone broth served with a giant piece of bone with some meat on it and vegetables. Its popularity is credited to its thick and rich savory broth. Although the meat on the bone is rather scarce, the reason why the beef bone is enough as the protein of the dish is because you don't actually need it anymore as the soup in itself can serve as a superb entre to pair with rice. Also, do not be afraid to suckle on that bone. It's really the only way to truly enjoy bone soup.

They also have curry rice and fried foods such as karaage and tempura which are all very appetizing and really just depends on what you're in the mood for that day. For the price, as I mentioned earlier, is one of the major benefits of a shokudo. The full set will only cost you about 500-1000 yen. This comes as a set to include the main dish, a bowl of rice, and some small side.

Ultimately, I recommend Mihama Shokudo for a quick and cheap lunch or even for dining solo when you're hankering for some hot soup on a cold day. To get there, from Camp Foster head towards the sunset beach baseball stadium using the bypass road along route 58. At about 400m from the stadium, Mihama Shokudo will be on the left. Look out for the bright orange sign board. Goes without saying but brace yourself for the lunch rush!

Osaka Ohsho is a Chinese cuisine franchise restaurant scattered all over Japan, recently opening a few of them here on Okinawa. Although their main dishes are ramen, fried rice, and other typical Chinese dishes, the gyouza is what really makes them glow. So popular in fact that you can actually order them by the box! I mean think about it; How delicious must your gyouza be if you have a system in place that sells them by the case?! I must say though that they do this rightfully so.

On occasion I find myself having a box of 20 of these gyouzas chomping them away like they are popcorn. Half the time I forget to even dip them in to soy sauce. The gyouzas can be prepared fresh or even sold frozen with instructions on how to prepare them at home. I've tried to cook the frozen one at home and due to the clear instructions provided, I think I managed to replicate the fresh hot ones just fine. Before I forget, they also have some pretty awesome sweet and sour pork dishes in which they use black vinegar (whatever that means) giving it that extra sour kick. An absolute must try! Make sure to save some room for that classical buchi ball dessert too.

I would recommend Osaka Ohsho for casual family dinners, movie night, or even for lunch if you have some time to wait for the prep. The other dishes may take awhile to prepare as they cook everything to order. There are about 9 or so locations here in Okinawa but I think the best one with the nicest view is the one located in the San-A Parco City mall located in Urasoe. Speaking of which, I think I might as well just head over there now for a quick 10 portion snack!
